With only a couple of changes to the team, we ventured down to the mini railway to play Lower Eltham. They had just come off a thumping win the week before which saw them average 8 runs per over in make 260. They also had 160 hit from them, so we knew that winning was not impossible. I lost the toss and we started well with Cam bowling with the wind and got their previous week century maker out for not much with a classy catch to PD in the gully. The other opener (ex Barclay Century maker) came in for a cameo performance as he is going overseas. He showed us the impacts of bowling short. Cam continued to bowl well and with PD applying good pressure into the wind, we got the second big run maker, from last week, out cheaply as well. The middle of their innings was a little disappointing a few dropped chances and too much short bowling on a very slow ground. 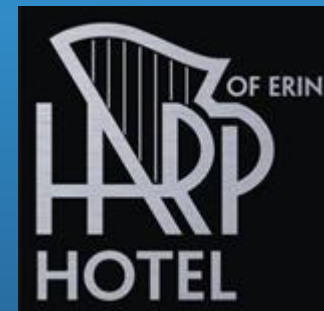
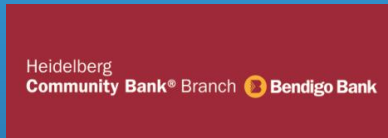
